Arrangements Made For Economic Independence of Austria, It Is Reported

VIENNA, March 15:- Chancellor Engelbert Dolfuss left this week for Rome to attend the Danubian conference. Some anxiety is felt as to what may happen in the country during Dolfuss' absence.

Dispatches from Rome last night stated that the conference between Italy, Hungary and Austria had resulted in agreement on a plan for economic independence of Austria. This may be the forerunner, it is said, for a more extensive economic agreement, also taking in France and Germany.
