## Russia Changes Route of Railway Line With New Pacific Terminus

Vladivostok Rendered Impotent by Manchoukuoan Developments so Nicolaievsk Chosen—Dreams of Czars For Western Development to be Realized

VLADIVOSTOK, Dec. 24: (CP)—The present Pacific terminus of the Trans-Siberian Railway has been rendered impotent by Japanese and Manchoukuo domination of Manchuria but Soviet Russia is developing a new port more than a thousand miles to the north at Nicolaievsk. The ambition of Dictator Joseph Stalin and his associates

is that Siberia be highly industrialized and that great commercial ports on the Pacific be developed beyond the dreams of the czars.

At present construction of the new railway line is being pushed with vigor from the Trans-Siberian line at a point near Lake Baikal to Nicolaievsk, the boom city at the mouth of the Amur River. The new line is hundreds of miles north of the Trans-Siberian Railway which now connects Eastern Siberia with Vladivostok and follows closely the northern boundary of Manchuria, the trouble zone in the Far East.

Large Congregations Hear Special Music and Sermons

There was a large congregation at First United Church last evening for the special Christmas service. Rev. G. D. Clarke was in the pulpit and the order of service included well known Christmas hymns and connecting readings entitled "The Significance of the Annunciation," "The Message of the Shepherd Story" and "The Message of the Wise Men." The choir sang very effectively the anthems "Behold, a Virgin Shall Conceive" (T. Smith) and "Let Us Now Go Even Unto Bethlehem" (J. L. Hatton), while Dr. R. G. Large rendered "The Star of Bethlehem" splendidly.

At the morning service the Junior Choir sang "Good Christian Men, Rejoice," in a very creditable manner. Miss Swanna Olafson, A.T.C.M. was organist at both services and rendered suitable organ numbers.

First Presbyterian Church

## CHRISTMAS IS CHILLY

Nippy Weather For Santa Claus' Visit Not Only in Prince Rupert But All Over West

With wind in the north, skies clear and cold and the barometer high and steady, Santa Claus is going to have nippy weather for his visit to Prince Rupert tonight. There is just enough snow on the ground to make it a White Christmas. Weather prevailing here today is typical of that throughout Western Canada and the United States, according to today's meteorological reports from all points. The coldest point to report is Pouce Coupe in the Peace River Block where, according to the provincial police, it was 55 below this morning. The mercury in the thermometer of the Dominion meteorologist at Digby Island descended at 4 o'clock this morning to eighteen degrees above zero, the lowest mark so far this winter.

According to Canadian Press dispatches received by the Daily News today Alberta and Saskatchewan are shivering with blizzard conditions in some parts while Manitoba is having sub-zero weather with light snow falling. With a blizzard weeping Southern Saskatchewan, temperatures ranged to 25 below zero. In Edmonton it is 24 below.

Along the lower mainland of British Columbia bright sunny weather is prevailing today after a light but driving snowfall yesterday. Vancouver also has the prospect of a White Christmas.

In Southern California skies are fair and weather mild.

## HOPES FOR AGREEMENT

President Roosevelt Thinks Naval Race May be Obviated by Time Washington Treaty Expires

### Japan Tractable

French Minister Urges Abrogation Of Pact—Soviet Building Up Pacific Fleet

LONDON, Dec. 24:—The Japanese delegation to the preliminary disarmament conference conversations yesterday received instructions from Tokio to discuss further with Great Britain the possibility of a compromise agreement upon naval disarmament. Any discussions at this time will be of a bilateral nature as members of the United States delegation are leaving for home this week.

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 24:—President Franklin D. Roosevelt expresses the hope that it will be possible for Great Britain, United and Japan to reach new disarmament agreement before the expiry of the Washington Naval Treaty in 1936 and thus obviate the threatened naval building race.

The president deplores war talk which is being indulged in by the "jingoist press" following the breaking down of the preliminary conversations at London last week and suggested that judgment should be withheld until after further conferences.

### Attitude of France

PARIS, Dec. 24:—Despite the recent refusal of France to join with Japan in denouncing the Washington Naval Treaty, the French Minister of Marine yesterday proposed that this country should abrogate the pact as being "intolerable" to France.

### Japan Alarmed

TOKIO, Dec. 24:—Official Japan is somewhat agitated at the report that two of eight new destroyers being built at Italian shipyards for Russia have been completed and are being delivered to Vladivostok where it is said the Soviet has assembled already a large flotilla of submarines.


It is a great pleasure to again extend Christmas greetings and good wishes to all, notwithstanding that it means that another milestone on an all too short road has been passed.


