LOADED WITH DEBT

In this country we have a lot of political pessimists who are always dilating on the various governmental difficulties including the burden of debt. We are told that the DANCE debt is so great that it makes life intolerable and that we are so deeply involved that we can never get out. If they are correct we have the satisfaction that the whole British Empire is in the same boat. In fact the Canadian per capita debt is lower than that of most Empire countries. According to a statement just issued by the Bureau of Statistics Canada's total debt is approximately five and a half billion dollars or a little less than five hundred dollars for each person. Half of that debt was incurred by the Dominion government and the other half divided between the provincial and municipal governments.

Owing to the sparesness of population, the difficulties of highway construction and the provincial railway enterprises British Columbia has a greater debt than any other province but it is not very much greater than the debts of several other provinces. It is twice as great as that of Prince Edward Island, the tiny garden province which should have no debt at all.

Compared with the total Canadia nper capita debt, federal, provincial and municipal of \$497, the debt in Great Britain, exclusive of local government debts is \$830 per capita. In Australia exclusive of municipal, the debt is \$885 per person, in New Zealand, including all local debts, \$1,-116. In South Africa the large Negro population makes comparisons difficult but Canada compares favorably even there. With a reasonable rate of interest the debt of Canada is not at all an intolerable one.




