SIMON FOR ADEQUATE BRITISH NAVY

Great Britain Ready To Co-Operate With Peace Pact for East

Not Willing, However, to Accept Further European Commitments—Urges Action Before World Disarmament Conference Collapses

LONDON, July 13: (CP)—Sir John Simon, Foreign Secretary, announced in the House of Commons today that the United Kingdom had given its diplomatic support of a "benevolent well wisher" to the French proposal for an Eastern Locarno Pact but he added that Britain could not accept any new commitments in continental Europe.

Concerning disarmament, Sir John said: "We cannot wait until the disarmament conference collapses before discussing what possible steps to take in case of necessity. An adequate British navy is the best safeguard to world peace."

OPERATED LONG TIME

Authorities Allege That Reifel Flooded Coast With Liquor For Five Years

SEATTLE, July 13.—As a result of the criminal charges which have been laid against Henry Reifel of Vancouver, president of the Brewers and Distillers Ltd., and his son, George C. Reifel, authorities allege that during the five years of prohibition in this country he had flooded the coast with liquor.

No Trace Of Three Youths

Sons of Mrs. T. D. Curtis of Vancouver Feared to Have Lost Lives in Gulf

VANCOUVER, July 13: (CP)—Search has been continuing without success for three brothers—Thomas, aged 21, Gower, 19, and Edward, 18—sons of Mrs. T. D. Curtis of Vancouver, who have been missing since they went canoeing two weeks ago. The empty canoe was recovered and the youths are feared to have been drowned.

RAILWAYS OF EUROPE

Interesting Comparisons Made By Dr. Hankinson in Address to Rotary Club Yesterday

While the transportation systems of Europe were interesting and often excellent and in some cases might be copied with advantage, Dr. C. H. Hankinson, during a recent trip abroad, found nothing to surpass the service given by the railways and hotels of Canada, judging by his remarks at the luncheon of the Prince Rupert Rotary Club yesterday afternoon in the Commodore Cafe.

The Doctor told of the improvement in the dining car service in this country of late. The charges had been reduced and a bill of fare passed around to prospective patrons with the result that people took their meals in the dining cars where formerly they did not.

IDENTITY POSSIBLE

Police Believe Close to Solving Mystery of Body—Note Deciphered

The provincial police believe that they are close to establishing the identity of the remains of a man's body which was found recently near Lindup in the Prince George district. The remnants of clothes which were found on the body are believed to have been similar to clothing which had been issued to men in the Penny relief camp about three miles distant. A queer character had been at the camp and the foreman of the camp is to view the remains to determine if they may be those of that man. The foreman believes he might be able to tell from the teeth.

A note found in a pouch on the clothing has been deciphered as follows: "If found, bury me quietly. Please keep the news from newspapers and radio but, if known, the condition but not the place. I am not hunted either for criminal or moral reasons. I am (word unintelligible) eleven or twelve years old in one way but more in another." No date, address or signature is given.

DOLLAR WHEAT IN CHICAGO EXCHANGE

CHICAGO, July 13: (CP)—Dollar wheat came back to the Chicago market today when near the close a broker shouted: "A dollar for December," climaxing a wave of buying apparently inspired by bullish foreign news. The Winnipeg market advanced 1 1/2c to 1 1/2c.

Fire Destroys Machine Shops At Yukon Mine

DAWSON, Y.T., July 13: (CP)—Fire of unknown origin destroyed the machine shops of the Yukon Consolidated Gold Corporation at Bear Creek, nine miles east of here. The loss is placed at \$25,000.

RELIEF WAGES ARE TO BE INCREASED IN THIS PROVINCE

NORTH VANCOUVER, July 13: (CP)—Hon. George Pearson, minister of labor, told the electors of North Vancouver in an address last night that relief wages would be raised to \$3.20 per day after August 1. Every effort would be made to eliminate relief rolls persons not entitled to assistance.

SEATTLE, July 13:—Seattle civic officials are wrestling with the problem of how to raise funds with which to pay \$700,000 in back wages to members of the police and fire departments.

Tom Douglas, United Front Candidate In Election, Is Slain

Robert McFadden, Believed to be Sufferer From Shell Shock, Placed Under Arrest and Charged With Murder

NEW WESTMINSTER, July 13: (CP)—Councillor Tom Douglas, aged 55, of Coquitlam was shot down in his gas station yesterday afternoon and died in Royal Columbian Hospital here an hour later. Robert McFadden, aged 40, believed to be the victim of shell shock, was arrested later and charged with murder. No motive is known for the slaying.

Douglas was United Front candidate in New Westminster at the last provincial election.

George Wilson, aged 39, was clubbed into insensibility in McFadden's cabin on Snake Hill, a short distance from the shooting, about half an hour prior thereto. McFadden is alleged to have been also responsible for this attack. It is believed by the police that he may have been temporarily insane.

Injured Man's Story

Wilson told the authorities that he and McFadden had returned from cutting wood when McFadden suddenly grabbed an axe handle and beat him about the head. When he regained consciousness and staggered from the cabin, McFadden was returning with a shot gun and pointed it at him but it was, apparently, not loaded then. Wilson dropped to the ground and feigned unconsciousness until McFadden left.

McFadden apparently then went to the Douglas' garage and service station at the corner of Austin and North Roads and shot the councillor at short range.

McFadden was arrested about three miles from the scene. He had the shotgun but offered no resistance.

It is stated that both Wilson and Douglas had been friends of long standing of McFadden. On being formally charged in court with the murder, McFadden was remanded until July 20.

WASHINGTON, D.C., July 13:—Senator W. E. Borah, stormy petrel of United States politics, will make a tour of the middle west this summer to tell the people there what he thinks of the "new deal."

He is opposed to the N. R. A. which, he asserts is being operated in the benefit of the big interests as opposed to the common people.
