Mineral Production in British Columbia This Year 24 Percent Ahead of 1933

VANCOUVER, Nov. 29: (CP)-British Columbia's estimated mineral production this year totals \$41,800,000, an increase of 24% over last year, J. F. Walker, provincial mineralogist, told the opening meeting of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy yesterday.

Gold production is estimated at \$10,500,000 in Canadian funds, fifty percent greater than last

Full Contents of Speech in House of Commons Sent to Four Great Powers-Discounts Churchill's Fears And Says He Cannot See War Within Two Years

LONDON, Nov. 29: (CP)-Sir John Simon, Foreign Secretary, wound up a debate on home defences in the House of Commons last night by announcing that the full contents of a speech by Rt. Hon. Stanley Baldwin, Lord President of the Council and Acting Prime Minister, urging Germany to abandon her policy of secrecy and isola-

tion, had been sent to Germany, France, Italy and United States TO PROBE with a full explanation by the Foreign Office.

Mr. Baldwin declared that he had not yet lost hope for universal arms restriction. While he "poo-pooed" fears expressed earlier in the day by Rt. Hon. Winston Churchill, former Chancellor of the Exchequer, of aerial attack of Britain by Germany and declared that Germany's air force today did not consist of more than one thousand planes, Mr. Baldwin nevertheless announced the intention of the government to stablish twenty-one new airdromes throughout the country durng the coming year as well as to ncrease the number of machines Macdonald. in the British air force by eighty or



More Relief

Unemployed Send Communication To Premier Pattullo Asking Greater Allowance

Local unemployed, following meeting, have forwarded a request to Premier T. D. Pattullo for an increase of one hundred percent in the unemployment relief allowance and an issue of clothing necessary for men who have to work outside under inclement weather conditions in return for their relief. The request is similar in tone to one dispatched by local unemployed exservice men to the federal government, the full text of which was published this week. Based on the minimum wage rate for the province, the four days' work per month now required is claimed to be in excess of the relief allowance granted. The allowance, it is contended, is sufficient only to procure the bare necessities of life and does not permit of clothing being ob-
