nce the treasury was empty, the credit of the province was such that hundreds of outstanding government checks were unpaid because the banks would not honor them. The Premier had first to establish confidence in his administration which he quickly did with the result that employees and creditors of the government have been receiving their pay regularly. Undeterred by the jeers of his critics, Mr. Pattullo made three jaunts to Ottawa and put up such a fight for provincial rights and the rights of the unemployed that the whole country admired. He succeeded in securing a modicum of relief but not enough to satisfy . either himself or the men who for years have had to exist on public relief. In the meantime, several oppressive measures have been removed such as the payment of income tax by those whose earnings were so low that not a dime could be spared for governmental purposes. Plans are now under way for a health insurance scheme but the greatest effort of all is that needed to bring forward a balanced budget. Until this is done the province cannot borrow and money is needed. for such purposes as the Fraser River bridge, the proposed road surfacing project and the payment of the bank overdraft of something like six million which is now being carried. The British Columbia government has not by any means given up the idea of the new deal in British Columbia. In fact the fight has only just commenced and much will be heard of it during the coming year. The use of national credit in finding work for the unemployed is rather a new idea and one that will not be accepted immediately but it is evident from the speeches and actions of the Premier that he expects to make his policy effective sooner or later.
