GREAT DUTCH PLANE IS DESTROYED CANADIAN NATIONAL EMPLOYEES TO HAVE PAY RAISED

Seven Lose Lives In Machine Which Raced Second to Melbourne

Giant Aircraft Was Struck by Lightning in Iraq—Victims Included Three Passengers For Java and Crew of Four

BAGDAD, Dec. 21: (CP)—The giant airplane "Uiver," pride of the Royal Dutch Air Lines, the same machine which was used by K. D. Parmentier and J. J. Moll to win second place in the London to Melbourne air race in the fall, was destroyed during a heavy lightning storm yesterday. The machine was found wrecked and burned with all its seven occupants ten miles from Rutba Wells, Iraq. The victims included three passengers and four of a crew enroute to Java.

WIVES AND HUSBANDS

New Legislation to be Enacted By Parliament on Recommendation Of Committee

LONDON, Dec. 21:—The Parliamentary law relations committee has recommended that husbands in Great Britain be no longer held responsible for debts incurred by their wives prior to marriage or for misdeeds on the part of their wives. Legislation making the necessary amendments to existing laws will be introduced.

HUGE HAUL WAS MADE

Bandits Pay Visit to Electric Company Offices in Philadelphia And Take \$40,000

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 21: (CP)—Five armed men invaded a branch office of the Philadelphia Electric Co. yesterday, scooped up between \$40,000 and \$48,000 in cash and fled. Bobby Naylor, Philadelphia hoodlum who is wanted in connection with four murders is believed to have been the leader of the hold-up gang.

Envoys Beg Of Prajadhipok To Return to Siam

LONDON, Dec. 21:—Envoys coming all the way from Siam knelt before King Prajadhipok here yesterday to beg on behalf of the people that the diminutive Oriental monarch not abdicate his throne as he has threatened to do following curtailment of his absolute rights.

King's Son Seeks Jockey's Licence

Duke of Gloucester Plans to Take Part in New Zealand Steeplechase

WELLINGTON, N.Z., Dec. 21:—The Duke of Gloucester, third son of King George, who is on a tour of New Zealand, yesterday applied for an amateur jockey's licence. He plans to take part in a steeplechase on New Year's Day.

ETHIOPIA IN REPLY

Makes Counter Charge Against Italy of Illegal Entry of Its Territory

GENEVA, Dec. 21:—The dispute between Ethiopia and Italy is assuming more embarrassing proportions. Ethiopia has replied to Italy's claim of wrongful invasion of Italian Somaliland with a counter claim of illegal entry of its territory by Italy.

DETAILS OF COLLISION

B. C. Packers Cannery Freighter Rammed by Coastal Liner at Dock at Namu

Dark and Raining

Nine Men Sleeping Aboard Smaller Vessel at Time—Might Have Been Serious

In regard to the accident at Namu Cannery yesterday morning when the B. C. Packers power freighter P. W. was rammed and sunk by the Union Steamship Co.'s coastal liner Cardena, Capt. Ernest Georson, master of the Cardena, on arrival at Prince Rupert this afternoon, reported that the mishap occurred at 6:30 in the morning at the cannery dock. It was dark and raining and there was a south-east wind blowing. The direct cause of the accident was the weakening of the steamer's starboard telegraph wire as a result of which the engine room was unable to respond in time to the astern signal. The P. W. was lying alongside the dock at Namu at the time. The Cardena was making the landing on her regular northbound call. It was when Capt. Georson rang the astern signal that the telegraph wire from bridge to engine room (Continued on page five.)

BERLIN, Dec. 21:—The minister of interior of Germany announced yesterday that German life saving medals would be awarded to the captain and members of the life boat crew from the German steamer New York which this week rescued the sixteen members of the crew of the foundering Norwegian steamer Sisto in a mid-Atlantic storm.

SIMPLIFY TAXATION

President Roosevelt Moves Towards Eliminating Some of Overlapping

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 21:—Secretary of the Treasury Henry Morgenthau announced yesterday that he had been instructed by President Roosevelt to make a survey of federal, state and municipal taxes with a view to eliminating at least some of the overlapping which now exists.

British Columbia In Need Of New Economic Deal; Is Being Milked By East Now

VICTORIA, Dec. 21: (CP)—British Columbia is working its head off drumming up business in foreign markets which is then poured back into the protected markets of Eastern Canada with the result that this province has an unfavorable trade balance with the east which amounted last year to \$90,000,000, Premier T. D. Pattullo declared in a statement yesterday rapping back at eastern critics of the province's attempt to control interprovincial export under marketing laws. The whole business showed, Mr. Pattullo said, need for adjustment of the economic relationship of the province through a change in the federal constitution.

Body of Slain Indian Child Brought From Port Essington; Inquest Opens Here Today

Inquest into the tragic death in the graveyard at Port Essington on Wednesday of Wilfrid Fred Spalding, nine-month old son of Nina Spalding, nineteen-year old Indian girl, opened here this afternoon before Deputy Coroner A. J. Lancaster. After the body of the nine-decapitated child had been viewed and statements of the mother, who is in a semi-conscious condition in the Prince Rupert General Hospital following an operation for abdominal stab wounds, and the doctor who performed an autopsy this morning, had been taken, the inquest was adjourned until after the Christmas season. It is alleged that the young mother killed the child by cutting its throat with a butcher knife, which weapon she then turned upon herself. It is expected she will recover. She is under guard of a police matron at the hospital.

Part of Wage Cut To Be Restored As From January the First

Upward Revision Will Apply to Those Not Covered By Agreement as Well as Those Who Are

MONTREAL, Dec. 21:—Extension of the restoration of three percent on January 1 and an additional two percent on May 1 to the wages and salaries of employees of the Canadian National Railways and subsidiary companies in Canada including Canadian National Telegraphs not covered by wage agreements is announced in a circular issued at Canadian National headquarters today. This places the unorganized forces of the railway on the same basis as those organized forces with whose unions an agreement was recently concluded.

Where a fifteen percent deduction from the basic rates of pay is now effective this will be reduced on January 1 to twelve percent and to ten percent effective May 1. Where deductions lower than fifteen percent are in effect the restoration will be in the same proportion. The restoration will not apply to supervisory and other officers receiving more than \$2700 per annum.

Personal Xmas Cards of Chief Executive Out

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 21:—Personal Christmas cards of President and Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt to their personal friends went in the mails yesterday. Containing a simple message of greeting and a portrait of the chief executive and his wife seated on a davenport before the fireplace in the study on the second floor of the White House, the card measures eight inches long and six inches wide.

SEATTLE, Dec. 21:—A fur clad gunwoman and her male companion held up employees of a theatre in the University district yesterday and endeavored to obtain the combination of the safe from them. The pair left without booty after evidently satisfying themselves that the employees did not have the combination and, therefore, could not open the safe.

### UNFAIR COMPETITION

It is easy to understand after reading the account of the investigation at Ottawa, why Quebec firms were able to compete successfully against anything that might be attempted in the west. In the silk mills they were paying an average of \$12.28 a week to their employees with some as low as two and three dollars. How could it be expected that a silk mill could be operated successfully in Prince Rupert if the average wage paid is to be twelve dollars a week? It could not be done.

We know that Japanese wages are much lower than those paid in Quebec but we are protected against the Japanese manufacturer by a duty. We are not protected against Quebec competition which, if the evidence given in the inquiry be true, is most unfair.

### THINKING PEACE

Too many people are still thinking war when they should be thinking peace. In Britain it is particularly noticeable that the leading men are talking more of peace than of war, with the possible exception of Winston Churchill. Everybody wants peace. General Smuts in South Africa favors peace. Most people who have any authority are working for peace although a few mistakenly injure the cause they espouse.

Let us try to get rid of the spectre of war by thinking peace. Possibly in this way we can influence the countries that seem to be inclined to favor the method of settling international difficulties by process of war.

### FINAL APPEAL

The Salvation Army has not yet enough money to carry out its plans for providing hampers and at the same time purchasing clothes for those sorely in need. In the rush of Christmas preparations some have probably forgotten to send in their contributions. There is a real need and we hope the need will be met. We expect it to be.

## CRANKSHAFT IS BROKEN

Excel of Petersburg Picked Up By Lysekil After Mishap

Having in tow the Petersburg halibut boat Excel, Capt. John McIver, which she had picked up in Queen Charlotte Sound off Egg Island following the breaking of the crankshaft of her 75 h.p. Atlas-Imperial diesel engine, the Prince Rupert halibut boat Lysekil, Capt. Al Wole, arrived yesterday afternoon and continued last evening to Ketchikan with the disabled vessel. The Excel was on her way from Seattle to Petersburg when the mishap occurred. The Lysekil was on the way from Prince Rupert to Vancouver to spend the winter when she encountered and rescued the disabled vessel. After delivering the Excel to Ketchikan, the Lysekil will proceed to Vancouver.

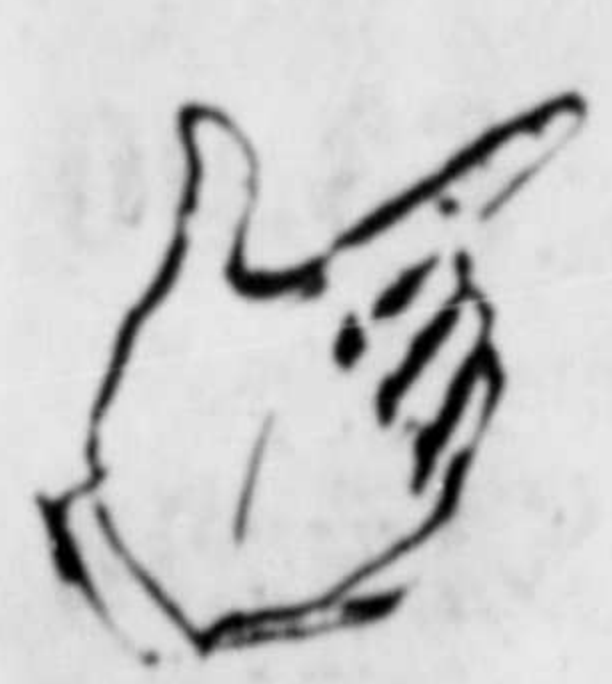

Defeated Grotto Last Night to Take League First Half Honors

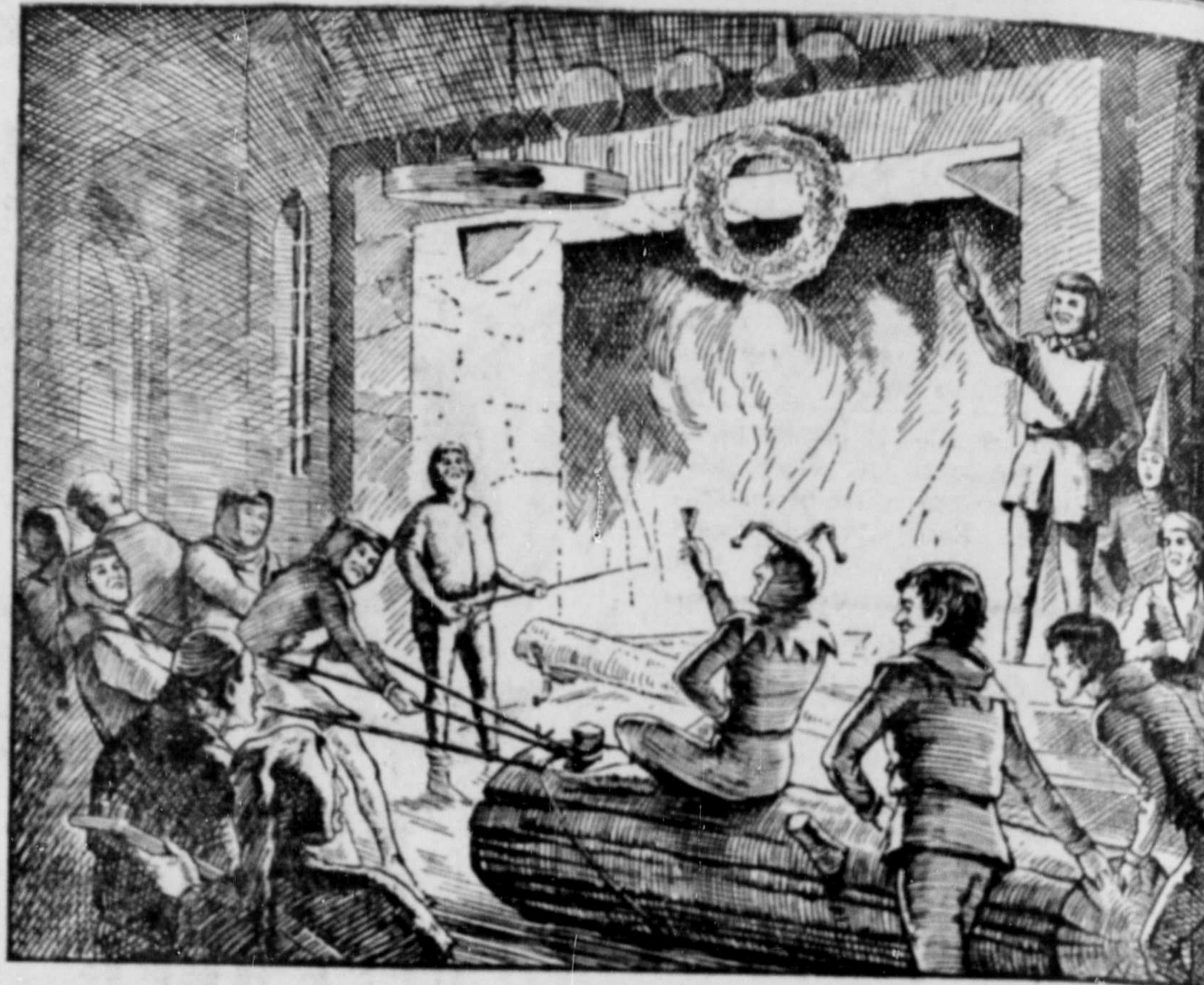

 broke. The steamer threupon ran into the stern of the cannery boat, putting right into it. There were nine men asleep on board at the time. They were immediately roused and taken off by a lifeboat from the Cardena which then pushed the sinking tender ahead of her into a nearby bay where she sank about forty minutes later. The P. W.'s masts are showing and she is salvageable.

After beaching the P. W., the Cardena returned to the Namu dock where she discharged her cargo and made repairs to the telegraph wire before proceeding on her northward voyage.

In some ways, the accident might be considered to have occurred in a fortunate manner. Had the P. W. been struck amidships, the steamer would probably have gone right through her and all on board might have been lost. Had she been struck in the bow, the results might also have been much more serious. The sleeping men were all forward.

There were eighty passengers aboard the C. P. R. steamer Princess Norah which was in port yesterday afternoon southbound from Skegway to Vancouver. Nine persons disembarked from the vessel while four embarked for the south from here aboard her.
