McGettigan Awarded \$915 From Canadian National Railways in Supreme Court

Mr. Justice Harold B. Robertson. in Supreme Court here today, allowed a total of \$915 to P. J. McGetigan of Savory against the Canadian National Railways in a suit involving the running over of cattle belonging to plaintiff by engines and trains of the defendant company. The plaintiff sued originally for approximately \$2000, about \$300 of which was abandoned before the suit was heard. Thirty animals were involved, these, it being claimed, having been killed over a period of about two years. The \$915 allowed was in respect of seventeer animals. Costs were ordered set off between the two parties in accordance with the amount recovered. L. W. Patmore acted as counsel the plaintiff and J. T. Harvey for defendant.

The hearing of this case concluded the spring session of the Supreme Court here. In a second civil case which was on the list. Charles Biggart vs. J. A.
