

Halibut Fishing in Area No. Two Closing on August 19, It Is Announced by Commission

SEATTLE, Aug. 2: (CP)—The International Fisheries Commission announces the closing of Area No. 2 between the Washington coast and Cape Spencer, Alaska, in which most of the smaller Canadian vessels operate, to all halibut fishing effective midnight August 19 because of heavy catches as a result of which the quota for the season will soon be exhausted.
