Ex-Ald. Hamilton Douglas Passed Away Last Saturday in Puget Sound City

Word was received in the city today telling of the death last Saturday in Seattle, after a lengthy illness, of Hamilton Douglas, an exalderman of this city, who took a prominent part in early day civic affairs here. For a number of years he was engaged in the real estate brokerage business in Prince Rupert. In addition to serving as an alderman on early day city councils, he was once an unsuccessful candidate for mayor. He had made his home for many years in Seattle and had reached a ripe old age when he died.

In addition to a widow, the late Mr. Douglas is survived by a son who is a well known Seattle dancing master.
