Terrific Toll of Catastrophe in Afghanistan and Baluchistan Today is Believed to be Worse Than That Which Visited Bimar Province in January

CALCUTTA, June 14: (CP)—An earthquake apparently worse than the disaster of January in Bimar Province shook Afghanistan and Baluchistan early today.

Only the most meagre reports are so far available but they indicate that there has been widespread destruction and a terrific toll of life. The disturbance interfered with communication services which, at best, are none too good.

REGINA, June 14: (CP)—A total of 167 candidates have been nominated to contest 54 seats in the Saskatchewan provincial election next Tuesday. Premier J. T. M. Anderson's co-operative (Conservative) government has named 44 Conservative and eight Independent candidates. In addition, there are fifty Liberal, fifty-three Farmer-Laborite and eight Independent candidates in the field.

J. L. Phelps, Farmer-Laborite candidate in Melfort, was disqualified on the grounds of irregularity in connection with the signature of his nomination papers. He is appealing to the courts with a view to getting back in the running.
