> KAMLOOPS, Oct. 3: (CP)-The new seven percent gasoline tax which has just been put on by the provincial government has been expended for the next twenty years or more and no money is avaiable for road construction, Hon. A. Wells Gray, minister of lands and municipalities, told delegates to the Good Roads League convention here.

"It will depend on what we get !----from the federal government next month," he said.

Revenue derived from the gasoline tax was to be applied to sinking funds to retire bonds outstanding for roads already in use.
