Fishermen and Vessel **Owners Both Standing** Pat On Liver Question

Outcome of Minimum Price Negotiations in Seattle Still Being Awaited-Puget Sound Boats Decide to Wait Until Friday

There was no change in the situation this morning as affects the prospects of the commencement by the Prince Rupert fleet of the 1935 halibut fishing operations. Halibut boat owners and fishermen were still awaiting word of the outcome of minimum price negotiations with the fish buyers at Seattle. Meantime, according to Canadian

Press dispatches to the Daily New: the halibut fishermen and vessel TO PRISON owners at Seattle, unable to decide TO PRISON whether or not to start fishing operations without a minimum price guarantee, adjourned a meeting held last night until Friday after noon.

The situation was discussed last night at the regular meeting of the local Deep Sea Fishermen's Union which decided to wait a few days to ascertain what developments might transpire in Seattle. Alex Duthie, president of the Union, was in the chair and there was a large attendance. The question of sharing of halibut livers was also discussed by the fishermen last night and it was decided to stand on the ground that livers should not be included in the LEGION HAS gross stock of the boats and that, therefore, the boats should not share in the proceeds. As far as the boat owners are concerned, it is understood that they are insisting that halibut livers should figure on the gross stock of which the boats take a one-fifth share. If the fishermen fail to meet this requirement, it is stated that the boat owners are prepared to take the fleet out themselves. Associate of John Dillinger Convicted of Murder of Department **Of Justice Agent**

CHICAGO, March 27:-John Paul Chase, former California bootlegger and associate of the late John Dillinger, was convicted yesterday by a jury and sentenced to life imprisonment for the murder of a Department of Justice agent.
