Manitoba Farmer Produces Excellent Crop. Rust Resisting And To Be Used For Seed

ARNAUD, Man. Nov. 28: (CP)-Harvesting 30 bushels to the acre plump-kerneled "Thatcher" rust-resistant wheat. Hans Lilleford, Swedish farmer here is the envy of his neighbors and a man of great interest to the Manitoba government.


Lillejord's 230 acres of wheat was surrounded last August by thousands of rust-ruined acres. Hi excellent crop attracted attention from nearby farmers, with the result that the government experihurried to examine the sample: A few days later a deal was made He was born at Ingersoll, Ont. with the province for 5,000 bushels at \$1.90 a bushel, to be used as

The government agreed to make! the seed available to farmers at silver closed unchanged at 65%c cost. with a limit of ten bushels per ounce on the local metal marto each of their customers. Two ket today. days after the purchase was made applications began to pour in, and within three weeks there 1500 requests with only enough wheat to

supply 500. Lillejord received \$12,000 for his crop. The new variety, named after Dr. Roscoe W . Thatcher, former dean of the University of Minesota, Agricultural branch, was developed after years of experiment at the University farm by Dr. H.

K. Hayes, Minnesota agronomist Lillejord bought ten bushels in | | | | | | 1931, and kept saving the entire crop for seed. His big test came his year when rust made severe ravages into U. S. and Canadian crops. It proved an unqualified success Experiments in the United States have proved just as successful. with 200,000 bushels being available to U. S. farmers as seed next year.

The wheat has good milling qualities but the flour has a slight vellow tinge. It is hardy, a good yielder, and most important of all. has proven a good rust resister.
