fornia, because of the alleged bribe. He never wavered from his assertion that the \$100,000 was advanced to Fall as a loan to an old frienda mortgage loan on Fall's western ranch properties.

Likewise, he insisted at all times he was motivated by patriotism, not chance of possible profit, in taking over the naval reserves. He asserted he had been led to believe a Pacific war was imminent and that it was necessary to concentrate oil in Honolulu for American vessels. Here was an opportunity, he said he had been told, for a man of wealth to perform an act which would immeasurably aid his government.

Ups and Downns Doheny's life was one of adventure, of picturesque ups and downs. Gold was his goal when he started from his birthplace, Fond du Lac, Wis., at the age of 16, to seek his fortune with his belongings on his back. He lost capital in an expediion into the Black Hills of South

In 1992 he reached the end of the rainbow-in a vacant lot in Los Angeles. He drilled for oil there-and

Four years later, he was broke again. But he recouped, and developed his California oil interests to an established position.

He turned to Mexico in 1900, and spent 20 years building up his interests, which pione red the oil industry in that country.

Doheny is survived by his widow, daugter-in-law and five grandchil-

Following them came Joseph of Arimathea who took Christ's body from the Cross and this Joseph founded Glastonbury Abbey. After him came Aristobulus who settled at Dorchester in Dorset. Thus being among the first European nations to receive the Gospel, so have the British peoples been the first in spreading world-wide. The three characteristics of Israel in the latter days! as foretold would be their belief in the Holy Scripture, their Sabbath observance and their charity to other nations.

Mr. Murray briefly traced the migration of the tribes of Israel from their captivity on their way to the place prepared for them "where no enemy can touch them", coming to the Isles of the northwest from Palestine as Britons, then Angles, Saxons, Jutes, Danes Normans, Flemings and Huguenots.
