Mr. Bennett, in view of the impending election, was ready to promise anything. The result is that Mr. Bennett seems likely to get the support of the social credit element in the province of Alberta.

There never was a more brazen, case of purchasing votes than the one in point. Everyone knows that Mr. Bennett has no sympathy with social credit. He is a "sound money" advocate of the strongest type. Everything he has ever done and said indicated that. Now, under the shadow of an election he expresses strong sympathy with the strong Alberta movement and loans the province enough money to carry it past the election.

Once the election is over Aberhart will get scant sympathy for his plan if by any ill chance the present government should be returned.
