Britain Will Not Press Peace Plan -Mussolini Bluntly Frank-Hoare Resigns

GENEVA, Dec. 18: (CP)-Capt. Anthony Eden, in a speech to the League of Nations council today, made the frank announcement that, if Franco-British peace proposals are not accepted by the League, by Italy and by Ethiopia, the British government "cannot continue to recommend or support them."

In Rome, Premier Mussolini defiantly told a "crooked Europe" today that Italy would "fight to the end" for her rights. He declared the war in East Africa was a "war of civilization."
