



He was born October 10, 1860, the son of a well-to-do London merchant. He was given a good education in England and on the continent but ran away to sea. He spent two years before the mast, and as a boy standing in the bow of the vessel, first saw the low shores of India. Fifty years later he saw them for the second time when he went there as viceroy.

He cotninued as lord chief justice of England until 1921, meanwhile becoming a baron. The outstanding incident of this tenure was his senencing to death of Sir Roger Casement, the Irish patriot, for treason.
