

Important Conference of Three Former Allied Powers Opens At Stresa; Treaty Sanctity Urged



French Statesmen Insist That Parley Must Squarely Meet Grave Issue Caused by Germany's Violation Of Treaty of Versailles

STRESA, Italy, April 11: (CP)-French statesmen, fighting for their views as to the sanctity of treaties, went into action at the conference today with Great Britain and Italy, apparently determined to make France's appeal to the League of Nations against Germany's action in violating the re-armament provisions of the Treaty of Versailles the basis for all actions by the gov-

ernment. France insists that the conference must squarely meet the grave issue caused by Germany's LIQUOR CUT violation of the military clauses of the Versailles pact.

Report of Mediation Board in Pacific Coast Marine Workers' **Dispute of Last Year**

SAN FRANCISCO, April 11:-A substantial increase in wages for several thousand longshoremen and marine workers on the Pacific Coast as well as a reduction in working hours is recommended by the federal mediation board on last year's shipping strike. The report was made public yesterday. Tanker seamen at present on strike are not included in the report.

THINGS TO DO Inside the House

Convert attic into playroom or extra bedroom by covering joists of floor and roof with lumber or wallboard.

Build new sun room or glass-in an existing porch. Build an addition to house. Construct fenced-in playground for the small-
