German Warship is Closed To Visitors After Crowds On Dock Get Out of Order ATTRACTING

VANCOUVER, March 18: (CP)-The German battleship Karlsruhe, which is paying a week's visit to this port in the course of a training cruise, was closed to the public on Sunday by ship's officers and police who feared for the safety of persons estimated at 25,000 who jammed Ballantyne Pier, where the vessel is moored, awaiting a chance to inspect the cruiser.


