Nickerson Tells Vancouver Of Benefits From Duty Change On Halibut-----i'omato Men Fearful

VANCOUVER, Nov. 20:-G. W. Vickerson of Prince Rupert, who is a visitor here, said yesterday hat the reduction of the duty in halibut entering the United States from Canada would mean \$60,000 a vear more money for British Columbia coast halibut fishermen.

Commenting on the agreement, Mr. Nickerson said it would place halibut boats operating out of Prince Rupert in as good a position as those out of Seattle and should raise the price of halibut by half a cent a nound.

VICTORIA, Nov. 20: (CP)-Indicating that British Columbia is in a spending mood again, the provincial government announced today that liquor profits for the six months ending September 30 were the highest since the boom days of 1929 despite reduced prices. Sales amounted to \$5,400,000, an increase of \$430,000 over the same period last year, while profits amounted to \$1,125,000, an increase of \$200,000.
