Well Known Local Figure Expired Suddenly Yesterday Afternoon From Hemorrhage

Having expired a few minutes earlier apparently from a severe hemorrhage, the body of Robert Henry Ive, well known resident of many years standing in the city and formerly identified with the Forest Branch service here, was found lying in a pool of blocd outside his room in the Federal Block yesterday afternoon. The discovery was made by Capt. Harris Kerr while on, his way to his apartment in the building. He notified Dr. J. P. Cade who, in turn, called the police at 3:10 p.m.

A short time previous George Grosvenor, a friend, had paid a call upon Mr. Ive. After they had chatted for a while, deceased got up and went to a basin and coughed up a small amount of blood. Little attention was paid to the incident at the time. Later Mr. Ive must have had a major hemorrhage and it is thought that he may have tried to rush from his room to Dr. Cace's office nearby, collapsing and dying




