FRANCE IS BACKING GREAT BRITAIN WAY CLEARED FOR ABERHART TO BE ALBERTA PREMIER

Paris in Favor of Supporting League Covenant But Would Go Easy in Sanction Enforcement

BRITAIN'S NEW HOUR

Garvin Urges Country To Embark
On Big Armament Campaign

LONDON, August 28.—Declaring that it was apparent that, in view of recent developments in Europe, disarmament was "as dead as a door nail," J. L. Garvin, writing in the Observer, said that a new hour had struck in British history. He urged the making of financial arrangements for a large increase in British naval and aircraft construction in order that this country should be able to retain peace on equal terms or be able to take effective military action in any eventuality.

The general opinion of newspapers here appears to be that the key to the settlement of the Italo-Ethiopian crisis now rests with France.

Tom Reid Is Visitor Here

Member of House of Commons to
Speak Tonight at Liberal Mass
Meeting

Tom Reid, popular and practical Scottish member of the last Federal Parliament for New Westminster, arrived in the city on the Prince Rupert this morning from the south and will address a campaign meeting tonight in support of Olof Hanson, seeking re-election as member for Skeena.

Mr. Reid was accompanied by Mr. Hanson who met him at Ocean Falls where a meeting was held last night at which Mr. Hanson was given a flattering reception. Mrs. Hanson also returned with her husband, the party also including Mr. Reid's two daughters.

Following tonight's meeting Mr. Reid and Mr. Hanson will proceed north aboard the Armour Salvage Co.'s service boat Pachena to visit Anjox, Allee Arm Stewart and Premier, returning here in time for Mr. Reid to sail next Monday afternoon aboard the Prince Rupert on his return south. Mr. Reid was the speaker today at the regular weekly luncheon of the Prince Rupert Gyro Club, dealing with the silver question.

SECOND SUSPECT IN BANK ROBBERY TAKEN; MONEY IS RECOVERED

KAMLOPS, August 28 (Canadian Press)—John Ponoploff, second suspect in last week's Bank of Toronto robbery at the Pioneer mine, was captured fifteen miles south of Lillooet yesterday. Most of the money taken in the robbery has now been recovered.

Canada Officially Instructs Its League Delegation to Support Peace—Mussolini Would Respect British Rights—War Risk Is Greater

OTTAWA, August 28.—The Canadian delegation to the League of Nations Assembly was instructed yesterday to support peace, Premier Bennett announced last night.

PARIS, August 28 (Canadian Press)—France will back Great Britain in support of the League of Nations covenant in the Italo-Ethiopian crisis but will oppose too rigid an interpretation of its provisions regarding sanctions as likely to be viewed by Italy as an act of hostility, the cabinet decided at an emergency session this afternoon.

In Office

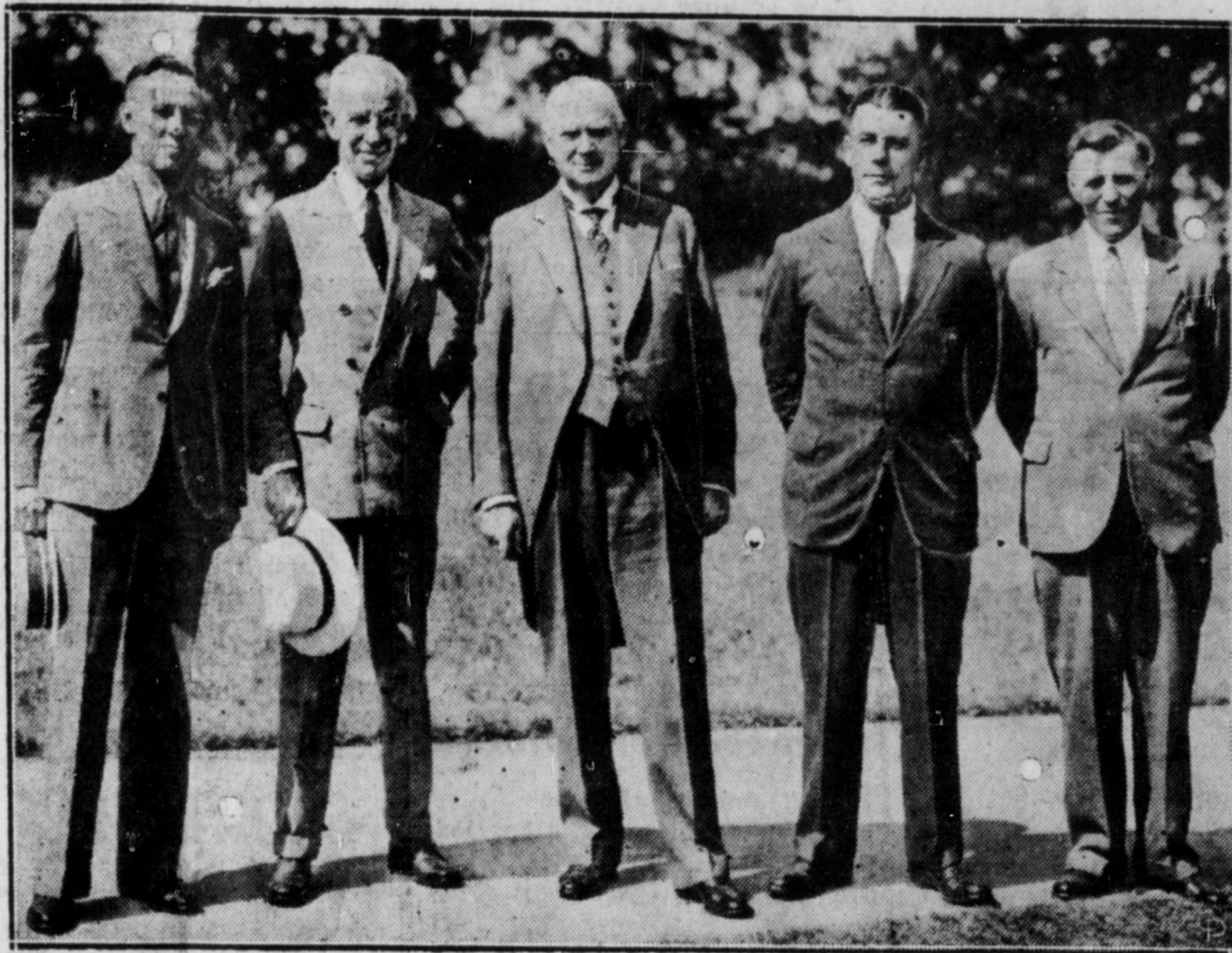

Social Credit Caucus Gives Its Leader Free Hand at Helm of Gov't.

Will be Untrammelled in Forming Cabinet and May Have
Any Seat e Selects.—Will Have Fifty-Six
Supporters in House.

CALGARY, August 28 (Canadian Press)—A caucus of sixty-three Social Credit candidates and members today endorsed William Aberhart, Calgary, evangelist, economist and High School principal, as leader of the party, making it possible for him to assume the Premiership next week. Aberhart was also given a free hand to select his cabinet and the caucus offered him any seat in which he might choose to run.

Winnie Mae To Be Shipped To Capital Soon

WASHINGTON D.C., August 28:—President Franklin D. Roosevelt yesterday signed the bill providing federal funds for the preservation as a national memento of Wiley Post's famous plane Winnie Mae. It is expected the plane will be shipped rather than flown East from Oklahoma.

Ninth Day Passes Without Trace Plane and Party

FAIRBANKS, August 28.—The ninth day having now passed since they dropped out of sight after having left Dawson on a return flight to Fairbanks, there was still no trace today of Pilot Arthur Hines, Mr. and Mrs. John Lonz and Alton Nordale, who left Dawson a week ago Monday in a plane which has not been reported since it was sighted nine miles west of Dawson. A concentrated search has been made over the country between Dawson and Fairbanks by numerous aircraft as well as by other means but without success. There is now believed to be little chance of the members of the party being still alive although the search is being continued.

LIVE EXHIBIT AT CARNIVAL

McRae Bros. Show Cathode Ray Oscilloscope Which Gives a Picture of Your Voice — Also Useful Domestic Machines

A unique and interesting exhibit was made by McRae Brothers at the recent carnival, the outstanding feature being the Cathode Ray Oscilloscope which shows a person a picture of his own voice. The instrument is used in balancing radios and in many other ways in servicing radios old or new. By means of this instrument it is no longer necessary to guess whether a machine is properly balanced. It is 100 per cent. accurate. It is the only instrument of its kind in Prince Rupert and is used in connection with McRae Bros. radio servicing department which has just been reorganized and is in charge of James Valentine, a graduate of the School of Technology at Calgary.

A second interesting exhibit was the Easy Washer shown washing and drying clothes. It has the vacuum cup and spin dry features which make the machine outstanding and in a class by itself. A practical demonstration of the Easy Ironer also interested many women.

The third exhibit proved of particular interest to ladies. It was the new DeLuxe model Singer sewing machine shown sewing forwards and backwards. On one machine was a pinker attachment in operation and another was doing practical and artistic hemstitching.

While the carnival management did not give many opportunities for those attending the event to see the stalls, whenever there was such an opportunity, the people were attracted by this live exhibit of machines and instruments dealing with home and happiness. Those who gathered around to see the work done were astounded at the marvellous accuracy, ease and usefulness of the machines and the cleverness of the oscilloscope in detecting error in the radio instrument.

WHEN MILK SOURS

Despite the attention the particular housemaker pays to keeping milk supply down to actual requirements during the hot weather, a certain amount of sour milk is apt to accumulate. Fortunately, little of this good food is wasted, for most people understand that, in the natural process of souring, caused by the action of harmless bacteria on the milk sugar, none of the high food value of the milk is lost, and although the soured milk is not palatable to drink, it can be advantageously used to make delicious cakes or cookies.

Spice Cake

1/2 cup butter, 2 cups brown sugar, 2 eggs or 1 egg and 2 egg yolks, 3/4 cup sour milk 2 1/4 cups flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon cloves, 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg, 1/4 teaspoon salt.
Cream shortening. Add gradually and cream well together. Add well beaten eggs. Sift the dry ingredients together and add alternately with the sour milk. Bake in a buttered pan in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.) for about 40 minutes.

Icing

Beat 2 egg whites until stiff. Gradually add 1 cup of brown sugar. Spread over cake batter. Sprinkle with broken walnuts and bake as above directed.

WHIFFLETS From the Waterfront

C. N. R. steamer Prince Rupert, Capt. Neil McLean, making the company's final voyage of the season to Alaska, arrived in port at 10:30 this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and sailed at 1 o'clock this afternoon for Skagway and other northern points. The vessel had aboard a good-sized list of passengers including many round trip tourists. coming south next Monday, she is expected to be filled to capacity with passengers.

A Junkers' monoplane, piloted by Charles Elliott, which is at present based at Stewart in commercial flying, arrived here at 10 o'clock this morning from Stewart, landing on the harbor in the fog and later tying up at the Union Oil Co. dock. Incoming passengers were A. R. Nichols, who has been spending the past couple of weeks in the Unuk River country on mining business, and Provincial Constable Lance Potterton of Stewart. The plane picked up a party of passengers who arrived here from Vancouver by steamer this morning and left at 11:30 a.m. on its return to Stewart.

Southbound from Alaska to Vancouver with a large list of tourist passengers on board, C.P.R. steamer Princess Louise, Capt. S. K. Gray, is due in port at 3:45 this afternoon from the north and will sail at 5 p.m. for Vancouver. The Princess Louise will be here again northbound next Sunday morning on the company's final voyage of the season to Alaska on tourist schedule.

Bringing in 6200 cases (six carloads) of canned salmon for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways, Northland Transportation Co.'s freighter North Wind arrived in port at 9 o'clock this morning from Ketchikan and, after discharging, will sail this afternoon in continuation of a voyage to Seattle.

Coming north from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands, C.N.R. steamer Prince Charles, Captain Dan McKinnon, left Queen Charlotte City at 9 o'clock last night for Massett Inlet and, unless delayed by fog or other reasons, should arrive here early tomorrow morning.
