WELLINGTON, N.Z., Nov. 27: (CP)-New Zealand's Labor Party, led by Michael J. Savage, won a smashing victory over the National government headed by Prime Minister Forbes in today's general election. Final returns show Labor with fifty-two seats, the National government with twenty and Independents with eight. Mr. Savace will form the first Labor government in the history of New Zealand.
