

INDUSTRIAL PROGRESS

The month of May showed considerable industrial progress over May of last year in almost every country except Denmark which showed a 42% decline. Belgium and Austria led with 20% increase, Esthonia, with 14.5; Czecho-Slovakia, 12.4; Germany, 13; Canada, 11.6; Norway, 10; Chile, 7.9; United Kingdom, 7.6; France, 7.5; United States, 6.8; Finland, 6.1; Greece, 3.9; Netherlands, 3.7 Japan, 2.8; Poland, 1.5, and Spain .8%.

These figures do not necessarily show the general improvement over a period covering the time since the depths of the depression. Greece has the highest index of industrial improvement with Japan second and with Canada and United States away down in the scale, not far from the bottom.


