"The unveiling of this memorial can hardly be regarded in the light of the mere unveiling of a war memorialrather must it be interpreted as a gesture of vital importance and significance to the British Empire. It was the first time in the history of England that the King had set foot in a foreign country-not as King of England but as King of one of the Dominions which make up the British Empire. Indeed, the ceremony was almost as much a consecration of the bond of unity which exists between Britain and Canada-two separate and distinct countries joined indivisibility by their devotion to one head-as it was a consecration of the war memorial."
