The party that Mr. Woodsworth leads is small numerically. It has hardly any eastern representation in the House of Commons and not a single member in the Senate. Mr. Woodsworth, being a good speaker, is often heard and carries more weight than his following warnants. While we realize that a very small section of the

population would welcome a move to separate Canada from the Empire because of a feeling that the interests of Canada are not always the same as those of London and there is another small section of the people who would do anything in their power to break up existing institutions, yet most Canadians are still British in sentiment and would not stand for any attempt to make a change in our allegiance.

The suggestion is made by Mr. Woodsworth that Canada, as a nation of the British Empire, is in danger of being involved in European wars. He would have this country take refuge in the Monroe Ooctrine adopted by the States many years ago which stated that United States would not allow any outside nation to acquire by force of arms territory on this continent. That would seem to indicate that, if Canada were attacked, the United States would come to the rescue and we would huddle trembling beneath the sheltering wing of the American eagle, without the will or the power to repel attack.

To follow Mr. Woodsworth's advice would seem that we adjure our allegiance to the British Crown. Such advice, we feel sure, will not increase Mr. Woodsworth's prestige in this or any other part of Canada. FOOTBALL MONDAY, AUGUST 10 Naval Reserve vs. Legion
