## Bold Scheme of Sanctions Against Any Nation Which Makes War is Russian Plan

HLDDIALE

GENEVA, Aug. 28: (CP)—Soviet Russia tonight proposed a bold scheme of League of Nations reform which would force almost immediate military sanctions against any nation making war.

NOTHING Russia, in making the proposal, opposed the amendment of the League covenant as impractical, but recommended the adoption by the assembly of a special protocol by which, in the event of war, a council of the League would be summoned within three days and after three more days would decide whether the circumstances called for punitive measures.

Military sanctions could be taken by states having an assistance agreement, even if the League council failed to place the responsibility for war.
