BORROWING FROM OTTAWA

It is rather good news that British Columbia will meet her own obligations next month instead of having to ask Ottawa to loan the money. Fremier Pattullo is not in Ottawa asking for loans. He is asking for an adjustment of the relations between the province and the rederal government which will enable the provincial government to pay its own debts in an honorable manner. If the federal government took over the Pacific Great Eastern Railway there would be no need of asking loans or if the Dominion government would make up to the province an allowance; for the huge sums of money sent east in customs dues or in payment for articles such as motor vehicles on which this province is taxed huge sums due to the protective tariff, sums which Ontario and Quebec do not have to pay owing to their nearness to the point of production. The western provinces pay to enable the eastern central provinces to make money.


