A STRANGE STORY

A strange story of modern communication is being told by the United States ambassador in London in connection with the relief of the United States Legation at Addis Ababa at the close of the Italo-Ethiopian War. The two legations in Addis Ababa were only five miles apart, but the Americans were beleaguered by a murderous rabble and no message could be sent direct. However, with a small portable wireless set the American minister got in touch with one of his country's warships, who relayed it, via the Phillipines, to San Francisco and Washington. Washington got on the trans-Atlantic telephone to Mr. Bingham in London; Mr. Bingham rang up the Foreign Office, and five minutes later Sir Sidney Barton in Addis Ababa was making his dispositions for the relief of Henry Cotton the threatened legation.






