By Mr. Justice Manson; Could Absorb All Workless in Land

VANCOUVER, April 15: (CP)-Mining, directly and indirectly, could take every able-bodied man at present unemployed out of unemployment, Mr. Justice A. M. Manson declared in addressing the annual meeting of the British Columbia Division of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association last night.

His Lordship advocated a Canadian national mining policy-a conjoint policy between the Dominion and mining provinces—"a policy that will give those who hazard their money in the development of our natural wealth, and so often lose it a chance to get their capital back-no taxes for the first year of production."

It should be a policy that would stabilize mining taxation for years.
