#### MEMBER FOR SKEENA

Bruce Hutchison, who has sat in the press gallery of the Legislature for the past eight years, pays a compliment to E. T. Kenney, Skeena's active member. He says:

"Mr. Kenney is the type of small town business man who comes down here pretty green but, by taking his job seriously, soon knows more than most of the old-timers, becomes a first-rate representative of his riding and future cabinet material. His grasp of economics and the larger aspects of government is not as broad yet as it will be, but such a grasp is often a handicap in provincial affairs-makes men try to perform miracles entirely outside the sphere of provincial government to the neglect of this Legislature's real business. Mr. Kenney is not one of those.

"He devoted himself in his speech principally to mining. In the vast treasure trove of his northland he sees the solution of our unemployment problem. Put the unemployed to work, he says, building roads and trails into our mining areas, and the resulting wealth will put us all to work. Concentrate on this sure thing."

After dealing with a number of points in Mr. Kenney's

speech Mr. Hutchison writes:

"Yet all these things, Mr. Kenney admits, are useless! until British Columbia can break the "unholy alliance" of finance, industry and transportation in the east which is holding us down; which is forcing us to buy dear in Canada and sell cheap in the world market; which is ruining us with excessive transportation rates; which is forcing our government and our business men to pay higher interest than they pay in Ontario and Quebec.

"British Columbia, says Mr. Kenney, quoting familiar! figures, has paid a 'tremendous price for the privilege of being in Confederation and it cannot stay in for merely sentimental reasons.' Strong words from the back benches, but you may expect to hear them increasingly!






