Hon. A. C. Elliott, Premier of British Columbia, 1876 to 1878. One of his first Acts upon taking office was to replace a discriminatory Voters' Act and replace it with a simple requirement that a voter must be an adult male British subject. During his term of office there were growing threats of secession in Victoria which were quieted, however, when Sir John A. MacDonald was returned to power in the Federal Government and gave contracts for construction of the railroad to the Pacific Coast.
