LONDON, April 6: (CP)-Three royal dynasties have filled the throne of England and passed away, and the dynasty which now holds sway has ruled for nearly two centuries.

While the Coronation solemnities in their essentials for the crowning of George VI and Queen Elizabeth on May 12 will be as they have been since the beginning of the realm, it is hardly surprising that through the centuries their actual celebration has been performed under the most diverse con-


