#### MEMBER FOR PRINCE RUPERT

Both those who agree with Premier Pattullo and those who do not hold the same political views will be interested in one view of his recent budget speech, that in which he enunciated his twenty-six points. It gives possibly a better idea of what happened than any ordinary report. It is from the pen of your old friend Bruce Hutchison who says in part:

"Premier Pattullo, who has been sitting back for nearly a month now, brooding, silent and grim, like a watchful bulldog, suddenly roused himself Wednesday. It was a splendid and titanic sight worth coming far to see.

"He started in the afternoon by gruffly sweeping the C.F. and its gigantic pile of resolutions aside. He finished at night by revealing, with one tremendous gesture, the whole past of provincial politics and fore-shadowing, with another, equally tremendous, its glorious future. And all through this, the best speech he has made since his salad days of opposition, one of the best in his life, his followers sat about starry-eyed, like children about their father's knee at bedtime.

"It was the old Pattullo again, with all his old fire, all that amazing store of sheer vitality which few men possess at half his age—the old Pattullo, pink of face, jaw out-thrust, eyes flashing; the leader who may be properly called the sword and buckler of his party.

"Here was the man who has never doubted clouds would break; who never saw any clouds at all, for whom all life has been sunshine and the world always as young and fresh as tomorrow morning. Here was the man who could pause in his speech, glare at the opposition, cry: 'We have no apologies to offer for anything — we have only reasons,' and mean it, and what is more, believe it.

"It was when he turned to the future that he really hit his stride. Here he was more vigorous, more sure of himself and in better health and form than at any time since he became Premier. In such good form that he could pause and read a list of all our former Premiers with their dates and suggest that he, having taken office in 1933, would go on 'ad infinitum.' The children about his knees fairly hugged themselves with delight.

"Mr. Pattullo needed no speech to establish himself firmly in his saddle, where he rides hard. He was firm there already, undisputed, unchallenged by his followers. But his speech, revealing anew the sheer and undoubted force of his character, still undimmed, made him more firm than ever, roused his followers to new heights of devotion, added another memory to what has become a charmed, almost a legendary, life in our politics."

#### BANK INSPIRES CONFIDENCE

NOT IN "WEBSTER"

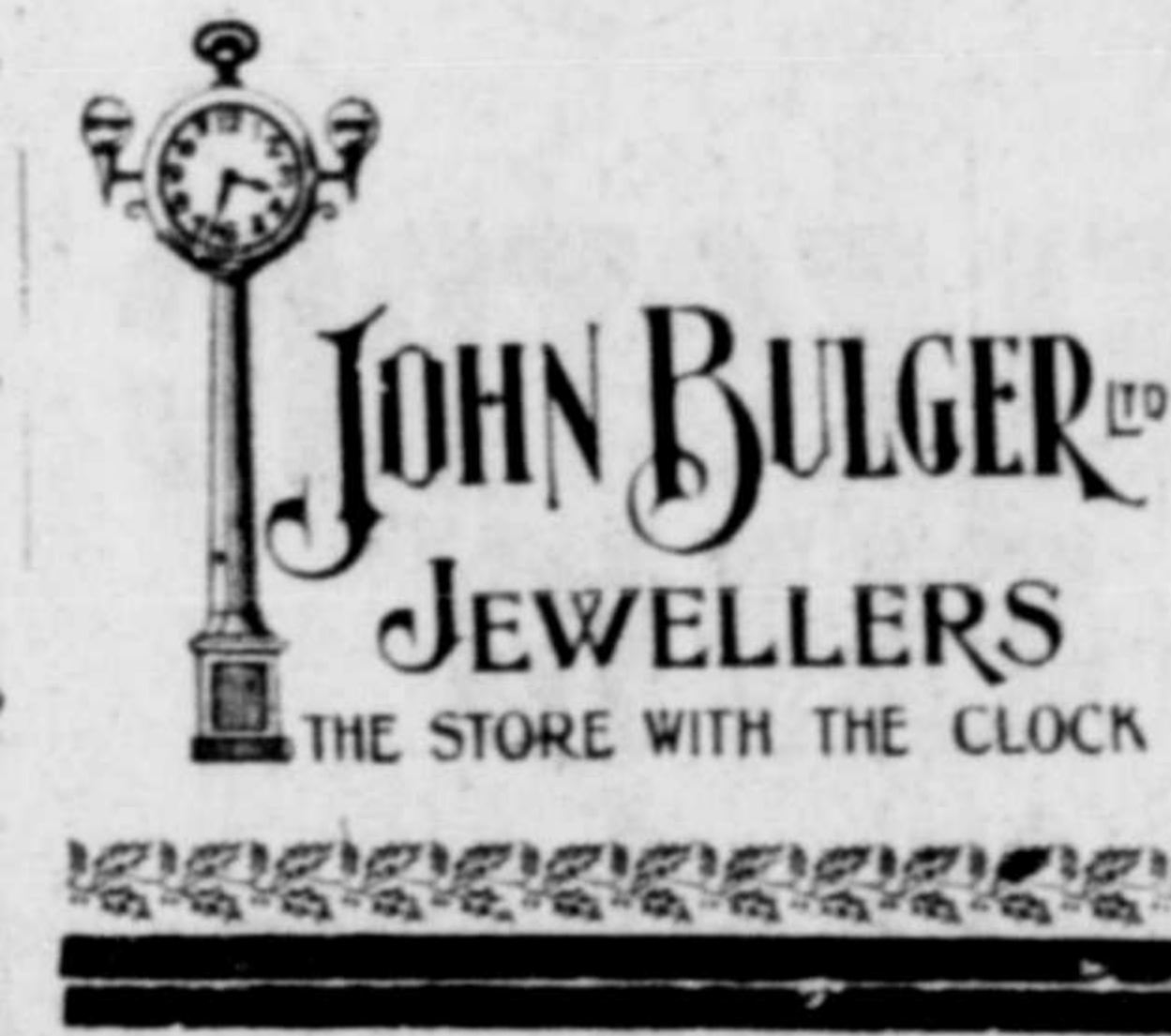
