Spanish Government Forces Are **Driven From Mountain** Stronghold

HENDAYE, Franco Spanish Frontier: Aug. 5:-Two insurgent brigades are reported to have driven Madrid-Valencia troops from their principal mountain fortifications on the Teruel frontier near Bozas and to have cut their main communications artery.

Insurgent infantry and artillery are also reported to have forced the point of General Jose Miaja's salient back out of Villaneuva de la Canada on Madrid's western front. Government sources say that Miaja's next move will be to consolidate his positions northeast of Madrid.
