## BIG RANCH IS STARTED

Son of American Admiral and Other Prominent Americans Take Interior Land

MONTREAL, Nov. 19.—Interested with a group of friends in the possibility of developing a cattle ranch of considerable size and finding no suitable opening in the United States, Richmond Pearson Hobson Jr., son of the Rear Admiral of the United States navy, who won fame by sinking the "Merrimac" in the Spanish American war, is coming to Canada as a permanent resident. With more than \$40,000 already invested and financing to carry on a three-year development program fully assured, the Last Range Cattle Company has been incorporated with a British Columbia charter. The ranch is located between Anahim Lake and valley of the Blackwater River, including locations in the neighborhood of Sigutat Lake and along the Eulichini Lakes in the country between Bella Coola and the Canadian National Railways. Here control has been secured of sufficient range and meadow to run from 10,000 to 12,000 head of cattle. Considerable fencing and building is already completed, twelve tons of machinery taken in and the nucleus of a herd is already on the ground with feed for the coming winter put up.

Principal officers of the company are Mr. Hobson, Allen Stuyvesant of Montclair, New Jersey, Lloyd Phillips and Gerald Van Amergen of Calvin Bullock and Company, Wall Street, New York, who is treasurer. It is anticipated the George A. Penneyer, now rated as one of the most experienced cattle men of Wyoming will take charge of handling the stock early next year.

Mr. Hobson's attention was directed to the large and promising undeveloped areas of British Columbia by the Industrial and Colonization and Agricultural departments of the Canadian National Railways. Officials of the provincial government helped him make his location.

Two Royal Canadian Air Force airplanes are again engaged in aerial photography out of Prince Rupert. The settings and photography of "One Hundred Men and a Girl" are fine indeed. The recording presents some new effects which, no doubt, contrive to make the picture more intriguing.

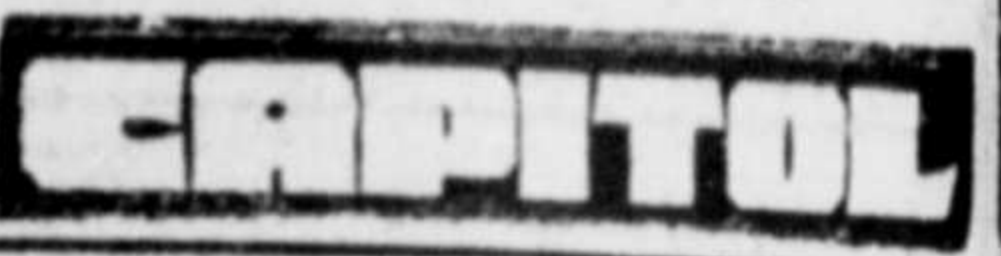
