NAVALCARNERO, Spain, March 23:-A new push is being undertaken by the insurgents on Gaudalajara, thirty miles east of Madrid, it was stated last night. The rebels claim to have inflicted three thousand casualties on the government forces in fighting of the last day or

Government sources stated today that the purusit of General Emilio Mala's insurgent army had been pressed against the strategic supply centres of Jadraque and Almedrones, 53 miles northeast of Madrid to smash Mola's attempt to reorganize his routed forces. Government bombers harassed rearguard positions where insurgent commanders were speeding efforts to unify ! disorganized forces.

Meanwhile at London Italy has refused to discuss the question of withdrawal of Spanish volunteers at a meeting of the non-intervention sub-committee.

Italy's Protest

PARIS, March 23: (CP)-Havas News Agency reported from London that the Italian government had handed to the British ambassador in Rome a protest against British press comments on defeat of Italian troops northeast of Madrid. Havas said that the tenor of the British press reports was inconsistent with the terms of the Anglo-Italian gentleman's agreement.


