SEASONABLE WEATHER

BUCKLEY'S XMAS WIRE

Pulp Mill Assured As Soon As General Conditions Improve, Says Promoter.

The following wire has been received at the city hall from P. J. Buckley:

ESPIONAGE DRIVE

Hamber as minister of mines and trade and industry in the presence of Premier T. D. Pattullo and other cabinet ministers.

BISHOP'S MESSAGE

Rotarians Hear Story of Christ at Luncheon Meeting Yesterday Afternoon

In his Christmas address to the Prince Rupert Rotary Club at its luncheon yesterday afternoon Right Rev. G. A. Rix, Bishop of Caledonia, said that Christmas had been stolen from its rightful place by social life and by business.

Christmas, the Bishop said, ought to be an exceedingly important time, not only to true Christians but even to those who were non-believers. He quoted the words of a great skeptic who wrote: "Among all the sons of men there never has been and never will be a greater than Jesus."

The Bishop then read the account of the birth of the Saviour including the announcement of the angel to Mary, the most astounding event which ever took place in this universe.

Speaking of the authenticity of the event, the speaker mentioned that the disciples lived with Jesus for three years and, as a result of what they saw of his wonderful life, they believed in his miraculous birth. The wise men came from afar to worship him and gave their offerings. He urged that his hearers believe in the Son of God and live accordingly.

HANGCHOW IS TAKEN

Important Chinese Seaport Captulated Without Struggle—General Offensive Begins

SHANGHAI, Dec. 24 (CP)—The Japanese announce that Hangchow, rich Chinese seaport and capital of Chekiang Province, 100 miles south of Shanghai, has been captured, troops simultaneously entering all city gates.

The Japanese spokesman also announced that a strong Japanese force had crossed the Yellow River in Shantung Province and obtained a foothold on the southern bank.

It is believed that the Japanese have begun a general offensive against Shantung.

To Make Amends

In Tokyo the Japanese government delivered to the United States ambassador a note pledging amends for the sinking of the United States gunboat Panay and asserting that "definite and specific steps" to prevent a recurrence of same had been taken.

Vancouver Company Is Given Job Of Building New Post Office Here

Word has been received in the city that the contract for construction of the new federal building to be erected in Prince Rupert has been let to the Bennett & White Construction Co. Ltd. of Vancouver, B.C.

Now that the contract is let it is expected there will be a minimum of delay in getting construction of the building started.

As announced before, there is an eleven month limit for completion.

AIR MAIL FAMILY BLOCKED TRAGEDY

United States Sees Hand of Britain Preventing Use of Route Over Canada

NEW YORK, December 24 (Canadian Press)—A Washington dispatch to the New York Herald-Tribune today says that the United States plans a regular air mail route connecting the United States and Alaska, a commercial proposition possessing a strong connection with national defence, but that the project has run into difficulties with Canada.

The dispatch says that Canada has so far not given permission for the United States planes to fly over Canada on a regular run to Alaska.

In certain official circles, the dispatch adds, suspicion is raised that the British government in London is responsible for the hitch.

Commercial jealousy over the established American trans-Pacific plane service is reputed to have led to British insistence on maintenance of a British northern route to the Orient, this route to connect across Canada with the transatlantic route of the Imperial Airways, the paper says.

# Waterfront Whiffs

### Development of Dogfish Liver Market May Be Important Here—Dybhavn and Carter Leaving For Ottawa

Some forty tons of dogfish livers have been shipped in recent weeks to a United States company and the price the fishermen were paid was five cents a pound. Not a big sum, perhaps, but no doubt a welcome return from what was "new business." When whole fish were sold by the fishermen to the liver-buying agent, with the exact weight of the liver obtainable from the body an uncertainty since the ratio of weight of liver to weight of carcass may vary considerably in the case of dogfish, the price paid for the fish was \$8 a ton. The immediate reason why the demand for the livers came to British Columbia this autumn was to be found in the trouble in Asia. The United States company which made the Canadian purchases had formerly been importing dogfish livers from Asiatic sources but this year there was uncertainty of delivery and the company turned to British Columbia. Possibly the result of this occurrence may be increased sales of local livers in future years. Until comparatively recent years nobody knew that dogfish livers had anything to commend them, except, perhaps, the fish themselves. When dogfish were captured for use in making meal and oil in fish reduction plants the livers were cooked and ground up with the rest of the body. In the same way, halibut and swordfish livers used to be thrown away as worthless in the days before it was discovered that it is vitamin content which gives cod liver oil its great health value and that halibut and swordfish livers are also rich in vitamins. A few years ago, however, science found that dogfish livers have high content of Vitamin A, and valuable research in this regard was done, by the way, by Canadian scientists in the federal fisheries service. And so their livers, too, were added to the roll of vitamin bearers, though in the scale of money value they do not come into the high brackets which have been reached by the livers of the more aristocratic halibut and cod and swordfish—aristocrats, indeed, by comparison, with such fish as cod and swordfish, for the dogfish is a sea-going gangster, destructive of fishing gear and decent fish, and a nuisance to fishermen.

John Dybhavn, member of the

Fisheries Research Board of Canada, and Dr. Neal Carter, director of the Prince Rupert Fisheries Experimental Station, will leave on Monday evening's train for Ottawa to attend the annual meeting of the Board.

Pouring of grain into the British motorship Moorby, loading a full cargo of wheat at the local elevator for the United Kingdom or Continent, is expected to be completed early this afternoon. The vessel will probably sail sometime tomorrow.

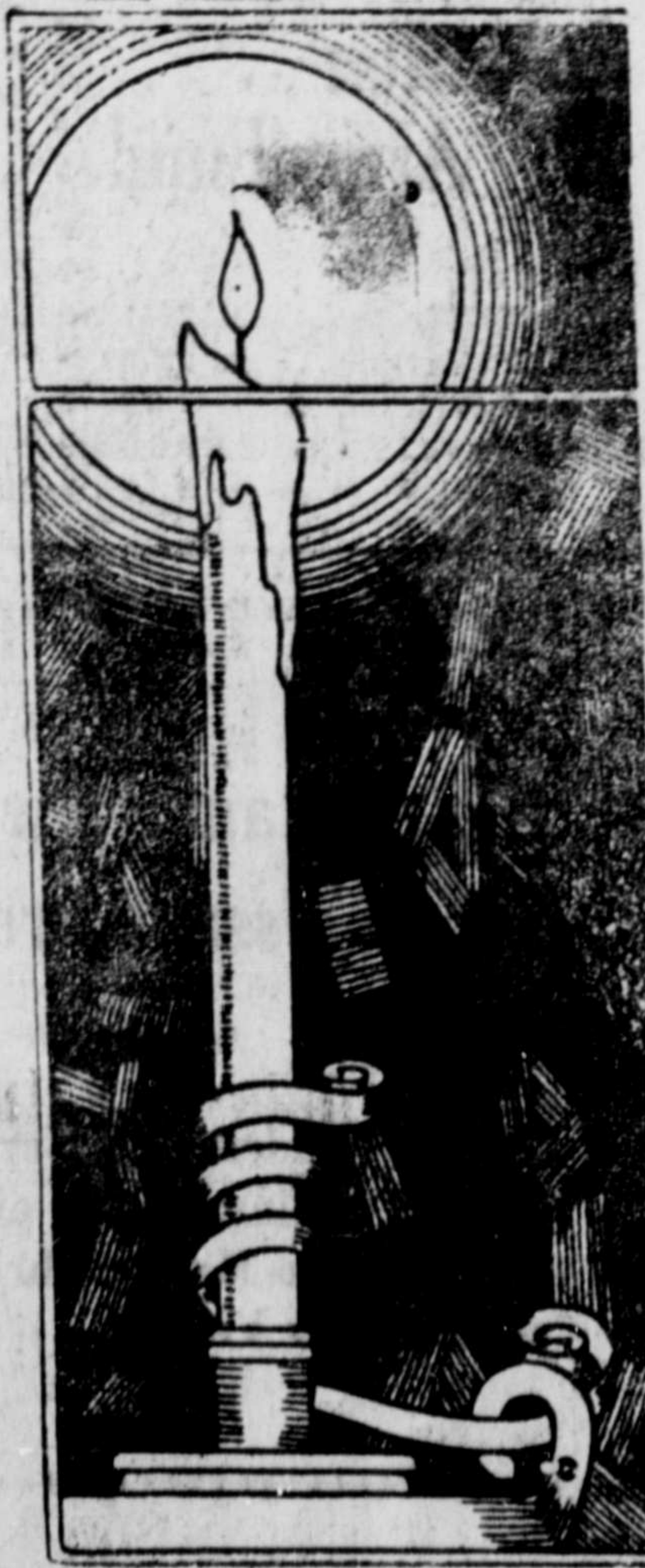

## SUCCUMBS SUDDENLY

John G. Viereck, One of City's Best Known Pioneers, Passed Away This Morning

Stricken suddenly at the old sawmill at Seal Cove where he was employed, John G. Viereck, one of Prince Rupert's best known pioneers, died shortly before noon today. Doctor and ambulance were called when Mr. Viereck collapsed but, by the time they arrived, he was dead. Heart failure is believed to have been the cause of death.

Mr. Viereck was 75 years of age and was born in Bellingham, Washington. He had been in Prince Rupert since 1906 and was the city's first carpenter. Besides his widow, he is survived by three daughters—Mrs. Gladys Glenn, Prince Rupert, Mrs. Mabel Dyer, Columbus, Ont., and Miss Audrey Viereck, Prince Rupert—and four sons—Riley, Gordon, John and George Viereck. There is a brother in Oakland and sister also in the United States.

The funeral will take place Tuesday afternoon with arrangements in the hands of B. C. Undertakers.

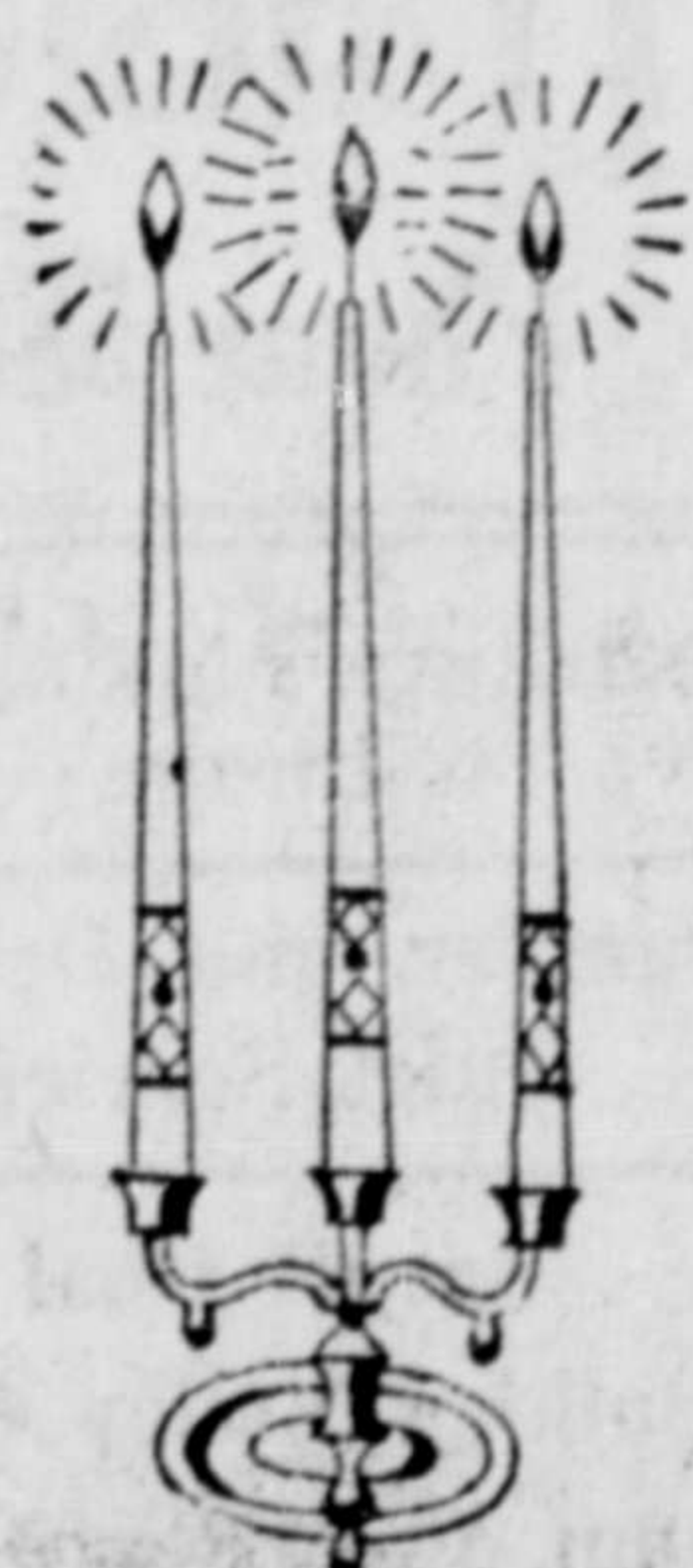

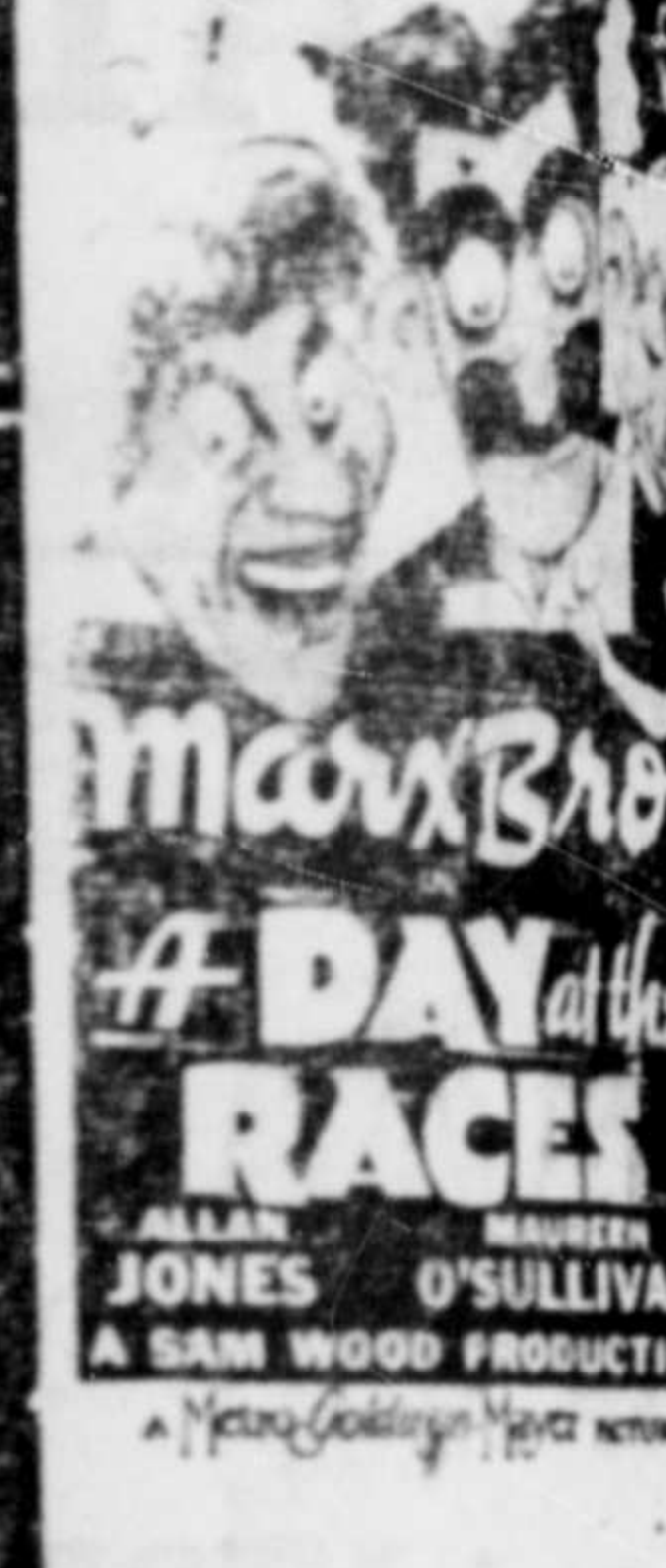
