A REFERENDUM OF ELECTORS

Are you in favor of granting to the Canadian-American Pulp and Paper Mills, Limited, or any other company, carrying on the manufacture of pulp or paper within the Municipality, in lieu of all other sources of municipal taxation, the following concessions:

(a) For Dry Dock Site—A fixed annual payment of One Thousand Dollars for a period of five years, and a fixed annual payment of Five Thousand Dollars for the next twenty years. (b) For Seal Cove Site—A fixed annual payment of Five Hundred Dollars for a period of twenty-five years.

(c) For each site after the expiration of twenty-five years, I lavor a rate of taxation not exceeding twelve and half mills on improvements and twenty-five mills on land.
