The circumstances surrounding the wheat trade were exceptionally favorable in 1936. Canadian ex- ports of wheat and wheat flour showed an appreciable increase during the first 10 months over the same period of 1935. The ex- port movement amounted to 207,- 200,000 bushels from January to October compared with 139,700,- 000 busheds in the same period a year ago, representing an increase of 48 percent. The increase in the value of our wheat exports was even greater this year because of the higher international pricc level—the exports referred to above were valued at \$183,700,000 in 1936 and \$116,700,000 in 1935— an increase of 57.5 percent.
