The minister of trade and industry is planning to make a survey of the territory between Prince Rupert and the Yellowhead Pass with particular reference to agricultural settlement. That is in line with the suggestion that settlement of farm lands in that area be pressed forward once more.

Close settlement makes it much easier for farmers to market their products by co-operative effort. Recently buyers from the south went into the Bulkley Valley and bought up a number of carloads of cattle, thus giving the farmers a ready market for cattle they did not wish to winter. With closer settlement and larger production of cattle more buyers would come and possibly local markets might be arranged which dealers would attend. If Terrace produced more apples and other fruit, a packing house might be established and, possibly, the protection of a marketing board might be invoked. Everything is to be gained from closer settlement, including improved railway service and greater influence of the north in matters political.
