#### ARE NOT DECADENT

It seems a pity that it should be necessary for Englishmen to tell the world that Britain is not decadent Captain Anthony Eden did so in a speech Friday night. It all came from the peace gesture of Great Britain following the Treaty of Versailles when Britain decided to take the lead in reducing her armaments as an example to the world. There was also being inculcated in the democ racies a peace spirit that would have been all right in an ideal world. It was the creation of idealists. Unhappily. there grew up at the same time several dictatorship where the very opposite was taught, where war was glorified and the policy of "to the victor the snoils" was " motto. It took one or two severe jolts to change the Pritish to fit them to meet the policies of the now ideals gies. In the meantime they had fallen behind and were being spoken of with scorn. Now they are rapidly regaining their position and a new note of respect is noticeable in the rival Furopean nations. If the present rearmament sneed continues Britain will again take her place among the leaders of the world and it will no longer be necessary to say "we are not decadent.".

Anthony Eden does not represent the British government. Although he recently left the government he is still a supporter of the Chamberlain administration and is to a large extent in the confidence of the Prime Minister. When he speaks it is as an unofficial supporter of the government but it is with its full authorization. It is something like when the newspapers of Italy or Germany make statements. The government does not hold itself responsible but at the same time it approves of what is said.

MONTREAL, Dec. 12 (CP)-Opera in English is the "only solution" for the future of the lyric stage on this continent, in the opinion of Lawrence Tibbett, who recently returned from an European tour.
