nation to an extent never intended. Canada has had to bear the cost of war pensions amounting to approximately fifty million dollars annually and the railway losses amounting to about the same sum. The final summing up of the despatch will be found interesting:

"In spite of the best efforts of the Hepburns, the Aberharts and the Duplessis to poison the minds of the public the conviction is held federally that the Rowell Commission report will be given the reception that its intrinsic national value will merit."

Evidently Mr. Hepburn is an astute politician and he has many friends both in the Ottawa cabinet and outside and he is spoken of as a possible successor to the present Prime Minister. At this distance it seems as if the latest coup will have strengthened him with various financial interests but injured him in the eyes of the majority of the people of the country.
