

HOW TO MAKE ICED TEA

Infuse six heaping teaspoons of Salada Black Tea in a pint of fresh, boiling water. After six minutes strain liquid into two-quart container. While hot, add 1 to 1½ cups of granulated sugar and juice of 2 lemons, strained. Stir well until sugar is dissolved, fill container with cold water. Do not allow tea to cool before adding the cold water, otherwise liquid will become cloudy. Serve with chipped ice.

WHIFFLETS From The Waterfront

With a good list of Alaska tourist passengers, C. P. R. steamer Princess Alice, Capt. William Thomson, arrived in port at 9 o'clock this morning from Vancouver and sailed a couple of hours later for Skagway and other northern points whence she will return here next Wednesday afternoon southbound. The vessel had 175 passengers on board, while none went aboard from this port.

C. N. R. steamer Prince Rupert, Capt. James Watt, arrived in port on time at 10 o'clock this morning from Vancouver, Powell River and Ocean Falls and sails at 3 o'clock this afternoon for Anyox and Stewart whence she will return here tomorrow evening southbound. The vessel brought north a good-sized passenger list including quite a number of tourists who proceeded east on the morning train.

Only one halibut vessel marketed at Seattle yesterday, this being the schooner North which disposed of 39,000 pounds to the New England Fish Co. at 8 cents.

Frank Waterhouse freighter Southholm, Capt. R. B. Bennett, arrived in port at 11 o'clock last night from the south and, after taking on oil and stores, sailed for Skeena River points to load canned salmon for Vancouver.

Union steamer Cardena, Capt. John Boden, is reported due at 11:30 tonight from the south and will sail soon thereafter on her return to Vancouver and waypoints. The vessel is making her Skeena River calls this afternoon and evening.

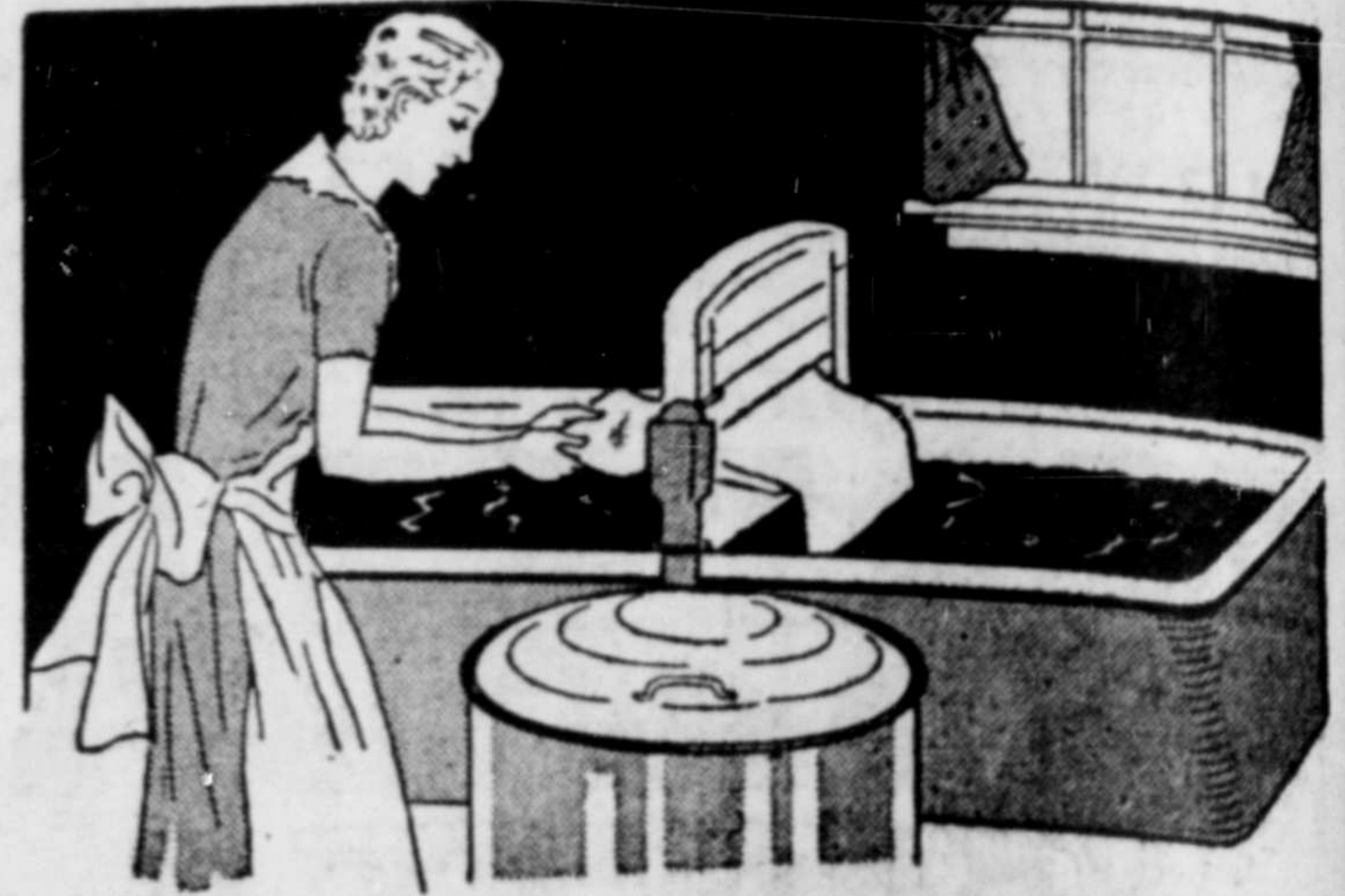
