TREATY WITH UNITED STATES.

It is much too early to comment on the recently signed treaty with the United States except to say that it seems like an ernest attempt to grapple with the question of international commercial relations. The whole Canadian-American treaty seems to be designed to be a corollary of the British-American trade treaty which was signed on the same day and published simultaneously with the other. 




