### Palestine Partition Plan Abandoned; Jewish And Arab Conference ls To Be Called

Glains

LONDON, November 9: (CP)— The British government has reversed its Palestine partition policy and will attempt to find an amicable settlement at a conference in London with Jews and Arabs.

In a statement issued concurrently with the report of a royal commission, the government announced it had reached the conclusion that "political, administrative and financial difficulties in the proposal to create independent Arab and Jewish states inside Parliament are so great that this solution (by partition) of the problem seems impracticable."






