POPE REBUKES MUSSOLINI
VATICAN CITY—Pope Pius, in a Christmas address to the Cardinals, expressed "bitter sadness" at vexations in relations between the Vatican and the Italian government. He said the vexations were the mistreatment of Catholic action and wounding of the concordat between the Holy See and Italy by Mussolini forbidding marriages of Aryans and non-Aryans.

BERLIN TAKES IT
BERLIN—A propaganda ministry spokesman declared today that the "Ickes incident" was closed diplomatically after it had culminated in United States rejection of the German protest against the speech last Sunday by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States. Although regretting that the incident had left a string behind, the spokesman said that the protest was voiced in such terms that it ended diplomatic action. Nazi newspapers continue publishing angry comments.

NINE DEAD IN CRASH
UNIONTOWN, Alabama—Broken bodies recovered over sixty acres indicated that seven, and possibly nine, men died last night in the crash and explosion of a twin-motored United States Army bomber near here.

WILL MAKE KING CHIEF
TORONTO—Leaders of the Six Nations tribe of Ontario are considering their plans for conferring a chieftainship upon King George on the occasion of his visit next year. All the ancient tribal rites and customs will be observed.

SHIPS IN TROUBLE
PORTLAND, Oregon—There were three shipping mishaps in the vicinity of Portland within forty-eight hours but none were serious. The Hamburg-American Line vessel Seattle grounded fifteen miles down the Columbia River but later refloated without serious damage. The British freighter Myrtlebank took an alarming list when cargo shifted in the Willamette River after leaving here but she returned to port and had the cargo readjusted. The freighter Maine was also ashore near here for a short time.




