Turmoil in House

LONDON, June 28: (CP)—There was turmoil again in Parliament yesterday over the news that two more British ships had been bombed in Spanish ports with the killing of four crew members and injuring of others. This made fifty-nine British ships that have so far been bombed in Spain.

The policy of Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain was again sharply criticized. Opponents of the government urged that British merchantmen be armed with antiaircraft guns for use in case of attack. There were serious difficulties in the way of implementing such a suggestion replied the Prime Minister. It was suggested that the government might be disposed to ban British ships from going to Spain as an indirect means of ending such attacks.




