Migration to Colonies LONDON, Nov. 21: (CP)-Large scale emigration of German Jews to three British colonies may result from surveys to be undertaken. Premier Neville Chamberlain told the House of Commons today. In British Guiana a ten thousand square mile block will be inspected while an individual settlement scheme will be attempted in

Tanganika and Kenya. Home in Palestine NEW YORK, Nov. 21: (CP)-American Jews will propose to the British government that it open Palestine to all Jewish refugees. Meantime, it is suggested that ten thousand Jewish children from Germany be given refuge there, the cost to be met by Jews throughout the world.

To Antipodes MONTREAL, Nov. 21: (CP)- A party of 150 Jewish refugees from Germany, including business men, lawyers and doctors, arrived here Saturday night. They are now on their way across Canada to Vancouver where they will embark for Australia and New Zealand.

How Canada Feels TORONTO, Nov. 21: (CP)-There were meetings from the Atlantic to the Pacific Coast yesterday in regard to the Jewish refugee problem. Many prominent people, including church, business and professional leaders, urged the government to do its utmost in finding suitable homes for refugees. In many cases, the German government was condemned for its treatment of Jews.

When the Commissioner took over the city, wage cuts were the order of the day, also the laying off of valuable members of vital departments, particularly the Fire Department which was reduced from eight men to six, together with a wage cut of \$30 per month. Maybe the merchants and others noted an increase in their insur- ern Ontario. ance rates at that time. The firemen have been trying for the past six months to get their wages advanced to pre-commissioner days. Also they have requested their regular two weeks' vacation which had been cut to one week.

The citizens have no doubt noticed the second hand appearance If the uniforms of these men who are obliged to wear their own clothing at their duties for the sake of decency.

After making formal requests for better conditions, the Commissioner was forced by the authorities to meet the men and discur their grievances and informed them that due consideration would be given their requests. The commissioner's ultimatum now is:






